I'd like to thank everyone at KI for welcoming all the members of my and Becca's families who came in for the occasion. They were all made to feel so welcomed and at home.

And of course, having my father oversee the installation ceremony was extra special for me and for my family. I'm also glad that Rabbi Seth Gordon of Traditional Congregation in St. Louis was able to participate in the ceremony. Rabbi Gordon is the current president of Morasha, the rabbinic arm of the Union for Traditional Judaism. LAWS AND CUSTOMS OF CHANUKAH

On the first night of *Chanukah*, Sunday, December 2, the three blessings below are recited immediately PRIOR to the lighting of the candles (not while lighting them). The third blessing *Shehheh-cheh-yanu* is recited only on the first day of each holiday in the Jewish year. On all other nights, we recite only the first two blessings.

Chanukah candles are placed from right to left side until finally on the eighth night, the Chanukiah is full. We light the newest candle first; therefore, we always begin by kindling the candle at the left and proceed toward the right.

On Friday, we always make sure that we light the *Chanukah* candles before sundown and before the Sabbath candles are lit. It is better not to light the *Chanukah* candles at all on Friday night than to light them after dark which is a violation of the *Sabbath* laws. On Saturday night, December 8, any time after *Havdalah* at 5:33 p.m., is permissible to light the *Chanukah* menorah.

Jewish law requires that on every night of *Chanukah*, the candles must burn at least one half hour after dark. Since on Friday night we must light the *Chanukah* candles before *Sabbath* candlelighting (4:45 p.m.), it is traditional to use larger candles such as *Shabbat* candles or tall tapers for the *Chanukiah* itself.

For *Chanukah*, one might light either an oil or a candle menorah, the only requirement being that whichever type of light is used, that it be clear and bright. There has been a great deal of discussion as to the use of an electric *Chanukiah*. Since it is not

definite as to whether or not an electric menorah fulfills the obligation of the lighting of *Chanukah* lights, it is best to avoid the use of such a *Chanukiah*, except for purely decorative purposes.

In general, on a weekday night other than *Sabbath* night, the *Chanukah* candles are to be lit approximately at dark. If, however, one is not at home or this time is inconvenient, they can be lit at any time during the entire night. If one has to leave home prior to dark and may not return for the rest of the evening, the *Chanukah* candles may be lit about an hour before dark, provided that *Chanukah* lights will burn for a short period of time after dark.

The *Chanukah* candles are to be lit simply for religious reasons and are not to be used for any secular purposes such as lighting other objects, reading lights, etc. However, this limited use of the light applies only during the first half hour of their burning. The rabbis of old determined that the required burning time of a *Chanukah* candle is one-half hour, and after that time, they may be used for any other purpose or even extinguished.

It is customary to place the *Chanukiah* in the window of one's home, on the main table around which the family gathers, near the door, or any place where lighting of the candles will become a public event.

Letter received from the Shawnee Mission Unitarian Universalist Church:

"We at Shawnee Mission Unitarian Universalist gathered on a Sunday morning in our sanctuary last week, and took a moment out of our services to write you a letter – to send our deepest regrets to you, for you must

be shaken and worried after the recent shooting in Pennsylvania.

During the service, we typically bring the children up to the front of the sanctuary to spend a little special time with them. They range from ages of 2-17. This week, we spoke about the shooting and how there are so many Jewish people who live in KC, so many Jewish people in our congregation. We spoke about how it made a lot of people feel (sad, angry, scared), and then I read them the opening of this letter, and then I asked, "What else do you think I should say?" This is what they said:

We have hope for you.

Stand strong in your beliefs and stand up for what you think is right.

We hope future generations will be more safe.

You are not alone.

We will do what we can to support you.

Not just thoughts and prayers but actions.

Trust each other.

Words on paper may not help, but knowing someone is there for you might.

Shalom.

We love you.

We are there for you.

Don't worry. We are on your side.

Make harmony.

We wish you all the kindness and hopes in the world. Know how very proud we are to be your neighbors.

THE KRAUTHAMMER FELLOWSHIP AT MOSAIC

Mosaic—in partnership with the Tikvah Fund and The Paul E. THE FLO HARRIS SUPPORTING FOUNDATION PASSPORT TO ISRAEL SAVINGS INCENTIVE PROGRAM

It's never too early to begin planning your child's trip to Israel.

Visiting Israel is one of the best ways to build a strong Jewish identity, but these trips can be very expensive. The Flo Harris Supporting Foundation's Passport to Israel Savings Incentive Plan is a wonderful way to save toward the cost of an Israel trip. In grades 3 through 8, when parents deposit \$200 a year into their child's Passport to Israel (PTI) account, the Flo Harris Foundation, (a supporting foundation of the Jewish Community Foundation), will match the deposit with a \$100 contribution. The Jewish Community Foundation manages the funds, while the Jewish Federation administers the PTI program. Interest is earned on the account, depending on market returns. By the time a child is old enough to visit Israel, he/she will have approximately \$2,500 in Passport funds to use toward the cost of the trip.

When K.I. parents deposit \$125, the K.I. Scholarship Fund adds \$75 to make the donation \$200 before it's sent to the Jewish Federation. Your deposit must be in the K.I. office by December 14.

PTI enrollment forms will be distributed by congregations to the parents of 3rd grade students. However, parents of children up to 8th grade (who are not already enrolled in PTI) are also invited to sign up for PTI by contacting their congregation.

There are specific rules for the use of Passport funds. The student must travel with a not-for-profit group that has a defined educational purpose and the trip should be of an extended duration – usually at least three weeks. Passport funds may be used until a student turns 30 years of age.
