From the Rabbi...



A few weeks ago, I attended a rabbinic convention in Boca Raton, a place which is kind of like the Jerusalem of south Florida. They are smart to hold the convention in Florida, and especially so in the winter! That ensures that plenty of rabbis will attend.

While I was there, I got to eat at the renowned "Kansas City style" kosher barbecue

restaurant called "Backyard Barbecue" in the nearby town of Surfside. Its owner is the former head of our very own local *Vaad Hakashrut*, Rabbi Mendel Segal, who I got to meet for the first time at the restaurant. When I told him that I'm the new rabbi at K.I., he gave me a very warm embrace! It's so nice to be able to make such Kansas City Jewish connections all over the country. The best part is that the food was fantastic, too. I finally see what all the fuss is about this Kansas City style barbecue!

The rabbinic convention was a really enlightening experience on many levels. One thing that stuck with me in particular this year, was the degree to which all of the rabbis present were struggling with similar issues. So many communities worry about the same things: how do we ensure our financial future? How do we attract and retain membership? What can we do to get the millennial generation engaged with their religion and their community?

This led me to realize that just as communities struggle with issues that are remarkably alike, so do individuals. We'd all do well to retain this sense of awareness and sensitivity in our interactions with others. When we encounter someone on the street, or at home, or - most especially, for our purposes - at *shul*, we should engage them with the same sense of compassion and patience that we would hope to receive ourselves.

This is one of the lessons of the coming Passover holiday. On the first day of Passover, we celebrate our freedom. But the very next night we begin the period of the **Omer**, which is a time of mourning. We mourn in memory of the students of the great sage Rabbi Akiva, who all passed away during that time period in a spiritually generated plague, because they didn't treat each other with sufficient respect. At that time, God held the righteous to an acutely higher standard, which is why they were punished so severely. These were honorable sages, but God felt that they were conspicuously lacking in their sense of collegial respect. Every *Pesach* we should remember to not make the same mistake, and instead, to channel our sense of triumph in our newfound mutual freedom into a celebration of, and appreciation for, each other.

ERUV TAVSHILIN

This year, with the closing days of Passover taking place on Friday, April 26 and Saturday, April 27, the ritual of *Eruv Tavshilin* is to be recited on the eve of the seventh day, Thursday, April 25 before candlelighting.

When *Yom Tov* falls on a Friday, in order that it may be permissible to cook on that day for Saturday (one is permitted to cook on a holiday for that day alone), the head of the household must perform the ritual of "*Eruv Tavshilin*" before the festival. This consists of taking some *matzah* and some other food, such as fish or meat, putting them on a plate, raising it and then reciting the following prayers:

בָּרוּדְ אַתָּה ה', אֱלֹקֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיוּ, וְצְנֵנוּ עַל מִצְוַת עֵרוּב. בַּחֲדִין עַרוּבָא יְהֵא שָׁרֵא לָנֵא לְאַפּוּקֵי וּלְבַשוּלֵי וּלְאַטְמוּנֵי וּלְאַדְלוּקֵי שְׁרָגָא וּלְתַקָּנָא וּלְמֶעְבַּד כָּל צָרְכָּנָא, מִיּוֹמָא טָבָא לְשַׁבְּתָא. לְנִוּ, וּלְכֵל יִשְׂרָאֵל תַדַּרִים בַּעִיר הַוֹּאת.

Blessed art Thou, Eternal our G-d, Ruler of the Universe, Who made us holy with His commandments, and commanded us concerning the *Eruv*. With this *Eruv* it shall be permissible for us to bake, cook and to keep the food warm; to light the candles, and to prepare all necessary things on the festival for the *Sabbath*. This shall be permitted to us and to all Jews who live in this city.

The food for this ceremony is to be eaten on *Shabbat*, April 27, the eight day of Passover, during the daytime hours.

Kovod Hamet Respect for the Deceased



Memorial Day services will be held in the chapel at Blue Ridge Cemetery, 1901 Blue Ridge Boulevard, on Sunday, May 26 at 11:00 a.m.

It is a custom in Judaism to show our respect for our ancestors, our family and our friends who are no longer with us. Whether it's the National Memorial Day, a day of *Yahrzeit*, or a day when we recite the *Yizkor* prayer, any day we go to the cemetery and visit the graves of our *mishpacha*, we perform the *mitzvah* of *Kovod Hamet*.

The Kehilath Israel Cemetery Committee is again offering the Flower Planting Program for those who have family and friends interred at our K.I. Blue Ridge Cemetery. For the nominal price of \$40.00 per urn, a beautiful arrangement of colorful living plants, prepared by a commercial landscape artist, will be placed at the grave of your loved ones. This year deer repellent will be applied every three weeks during the summer to deter the deer.

If this is the first year to participate in the program, it will be necessary to order a concrete urn from the cemetery at a one time charge of \$75.00. This urn will be used every year for no additional charge other than the flowers. It is the policy of the cemetery that only flowers purchased through this program can be placed on graves.

All orders must be paid in advance and received at the synagogue office no later than April 26. This gives us the time needed so that the plants will be in full bloom by Memorial Day this year.

Give your loved ones who are interred in our cemetery the *kovod* of remembering them, whether it's with flowers or a visit to their graves. The cemetery committee is making every effort to maintain the grounds to be clean and beautiful, and extra care is being given to keep the plants watered, trimmed and green during the summer months.

Cemetery lots are available for sale to any Jewish person. Anyone interested in reserving individual lots or family sections should call the synagogue office at 913.642.1880 ext 202 for assistance.

K.I. Blue Ridge Cemetery is open every day, with the exception of *Shabbat* and Jewish holidays. The supervisor, Rod Sipe, can assist you in finding the location of a grave site. Normal visiting hours are 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. If it is necessary that you visit the cemetery at another time, please call Mr. Sipe at 816.916.3655 and make special arrangements.


