The winter is upon us! We have some exciting events coming up. The weekly Women's Class is back up and running on Wednesday nights, with Rabbi Mandl and I alternating weeks. I'm also looking forward to beginning my weekly Thursday night class on the subject of "Understanding the *Siddur*;" beginning on Thursday, December 5th, and then continuing on December 12 and 26.

On Thursday night, December 19th we're introducing what we hope to become a monthly event going forward, co-presented by K.I., BIAV, and the KC *Kollel*: "The Monthly Nosh and Learn." Featuring myself along with Rabbis Mizrahi (BIAV) and Rubin (*Kollel*), the three of us will teach on a different topic each month, and snacks will be served. One of the fascinating aspects of *Chanukah* is that it's our only holiday which doesn't appear in the *Tanach* (Hebrew Bible), having occurred after our scriptures were already canonized. Rabbis throughout the ages have commented that this shows the power of human initiative in Jewish thought. It shows that the *Torah* remains dynamic and alive, and not static. For, just as we have the theoretical power to create new holidays, so too does the tradition of the Oral *Torah* grant us the power to unlock new layers of meaning and new insights from the written *Torah* in every generation.

I hope that in this month of December, and on this *Chanukah* of 5780, we can all merit to experience that sense of the dynamism of *Torah* in our own lives, through our connection with our K.I. community.

LAWS AND CUSTOMS OF CHANUKAH

On the first night of *Chanukah*, Sunday, December 22, three blessings below are recited immediately PRIOR to the lighting of the candles (not while lighting them). On all other nights, we recite only the first two blessings.

Chanukah candles are placed from right to left side until finally on the eighth night, the *Chanukiah* is full. We light the newest candle first; therefore, we always begin by kindling the candle at the left and proceed toward the right.

Shabbat always takes precedence over other holidays; therefore, on December 27, the Friday night of Chanukah, we should light the Chanukah candles first and then the Shabbat candles. Both need to be done by 4:45 pm, and since the Chanukah candles need to burn at least one half hour after dark, it is traditional to use larger candles such as Shabbat candles or tall tapers for the chanukiah. On Saturday night, December 28, one should recite Havdalah first, after 5:41 pm, and then light the Chanukah candles.

On Saturday night, December 28, any time after *Havdalah* at 5:41 p.m., it is permissible to light the *Chanukah menorah* (*Chanukiah*).

For *Chanukah*, one might light either an oil or a candle *menorah*, the only requirement being that whichever type of light is used, it should be clear and bright. There has been a

great deal of discussion as to the use of an electric *Chanukiah*. Since it is not definite as to whether or not an electric *menorah* fulfills the obligation of the lighting of *Chanukah* lights, it is best to avoid the use of such a *Chanukiah*, except for purely decorative purposes.

In general, on a weekday night other than *Sabbath* night, the *Chanukah* candles are to be lit approximately at dark. If, however, one is not at home or this time is inconvenient, they can be lit at any time during the entire night. If one has to leave home prior to dark and may not return for the rest of the evening, the *Chanukah* candles may be lit about an hour before dark, provided that *Chanukah* lights will burn for a short period of time after dark.

The *Chanukah* candles are to be lit simply for religious reasons and are not to be used for any secular purposes such as lighting other objects, reading lights, etc. The rabbis of old determined that the required burning time of a *Chanukah* candle is one half hour, and after that time, they may be used for any other purpose or even extinguished.

It is customary to place the *Chanukiah* in the window of one's home, on the main table around which the family gathers, near the door, or any place where lighting of the candles will become a public event.



JACOB AND ROSE SZNELER SCHOARSHIP FUND FOR TRAVEL TO ISRAEL AND/OR EASTERN EUROPE ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS

In July 2016, the Beth Shalom Foundation received a number of contributions to establish the Jacob and Rose Szneler Scholarship Fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide funds to high school students to help underwrite the costs of their participation in an organized trip to Israel and/ or Eastern Europe.

Although the funds reside in the Beth Shalom Foundation, all Jewish students in Kansas City and Des Moines, Iowa, are eligible to apply. 2019 applications are due by January 10, 2020 and should be e-mailed to diane.azorsky@yahoo.com.

Applications should include: Student's name; grade he/she will be entering in fall 2019; name of Israel and/or Eastern Europe program and sponsoring organization; and, a 300-400 word essay explaining why you chose to participate in this trip.

Jacob and Rose Szneler were extraordinary people. Both were born in Poland, spent the war in a number of concentration and work camps and, horrifically, lost their entire immediate families in the Holocaust. After the liberation, Rose and Jacob met in Bergen-Belsen in 1945. They were married in 1946 and immigrated to Des Moines, Iowa in 1950 under the auspices of HIAS. They did not know English, and attended night school in Des Moines to learn English and proudly become United States citizens. Rose worked as a seamstress for a furrier and Jacob worked in a bag factory.

Jacob and Rose each were devoted Jews who benefited their communities with their kindness, hospitality and sense of humor. They cared deeply for the orphan, the widow, the aged and the sick. Jacob and Rose took great pride in the State of Israel and the traditions and history of their people. Jacob died in Des Moines in 1994 and Rose passed away in 2014 in Kansas City (her adopted home).

THE FLO HARRIS SUPPORTING FOUNDATION PASSPORT TO ISRAEL SAVINGS INCENTIVE PROGRAM

It's never too early to begin planning your child's trip to Israel Visiting Israel is one of the best ways to build a strong Jewish identity, but these trips can be very expensive. The Flo Harris Supporting Foundation's Passport to Israel Savings Incentive Plan is a wonderful way to save toward the cost of an Israel trip. In grades 3 through 8, when parents deposit \$200 a year into their child's Passport to Israel (PTI) account, the Flo Harris Foundation, (a supporting foundation of the Jewish Community Foundation), will match the deposit with a \$100 contribution. The Jewish Community Foundation manages the funds, while The Jewish Federation administers the PTI program. Interest is earned on the account, depending on market returns. By the time a child is old enough to visit Israel, he/she could have approximately \$2,500 in Passport funds to use toward the cost of the trip.

PTI enrollment forms will be distributed by congregations to the parents of 3rd grade students. However, parents of children up to 8th grade (who are not already enrolled in PTI) are also invited to sign up for PTI by contacting their congregation.

When K.I. parents deposit \$125, the K.I. Scholarship Fund adds \$75 to make the donation \$200 before it's sent to the Jewish Federation. Your deposit must be in the K.I. office by December 13.

There are specific rules for the use of Passport funds. The student must travel with a not-for-profit group that has a defined educational purpose and the trip should be of an extended

duration – usually at least three weeks. Passport funds may be used until a student turns 30 years of age.
