From The Rabbi...



Another personal Kansas City milestone reached - I recently attended my first Chiefs game! Although it was a heart breaker - a one point loss to the Chargers in the final seconds of the game - I still walked away inspired by the "ruach," the spirit and the atmosphere, at Arrowhead Stadium, which I'm told is officially the

loudest stadium in the league. I left the game thinking: if only we can channel a small part of that energy, enthusiasm and excitement in *shul*!

The winter tends to be a slow time in the Jewish calendar, and hence in the life of many synagogues. At K.I., we have a number of "snow birds" taking off for Florida around now. But that doesn't mean that we are slowing down!

Our family *Chanukah* party was a rousing success. The social hall was full, with K.I. and non-K.I. members alike, eating *latkes* and brisket, and celebrating the holiday together. We hope to replicate that vibrant energy for the *Purim* party in late March.

We also celebrated a *Bar Mitzvah* at K.I. in December. The second half focuses on the minutiae of building the Tabernacle in the desert. It must be, he answers, that the Exodus was only considered to be complete when the people had a Temple of their own, as a central place of communion and worship. That was the true culmination of their liberation, Ramban says. May we all merit to be able to relate to our synagogue, our own "minor Temple," as a place to feel that sense of liberation and peace!

Happy Purim

K.I. FRED DEVINKI RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NEWS

Students in the K.I. Fred Devinki Religious School have had a productive and educational first semester. On Tuesdays, the students have continued to learn to read and understand Hebrew. Currently, we are working on exceptions to the pronunciation rules in Hebrew.

The pre-K through 1st grade group learned about *Chanukah* during the last two months, by reviewing the story of *Chanukah*. They each decorated their own *menorah* and learned various *Chanukah* songs to help them celebrate *Chanukah*. Additionally, they learned about the *parsha* each week.

In the 3rd-5th grade group, we have been beginning each class with the weekly *parsha*. After winter break, we will be studying the *Shemot* and *Moshe Rabbenu*. Look for our plans for a *Tu B'Shevat seder* in January.

The 6th-7th grade group reviewed various traditions associated with *Chanukah*, including eating foods made with oil, playing *dreidel* and which order to light the *Chanukah* lights. They also reviewed the reasons for these traditions. They each decorated and put together their own *Chanukah menorah*. During this time, they also continued to learn the weekly *parsha* and began studying the *Amidah* in depth. They are currently in the middle of putting together a family tree of the patriarchal family. The completed part is on display on the wall in the main area of the school wing.

All the students spent several Sundays preparing to sing at the congregational *Chanukah* dinner. A special thanks to **Clint Gillom**, who not only accompanied us at the dinner, he came to practice with us twice.

On December 9, we had a family day to celebrate *Chanukah*. Before other children arrived, the students enjoyed sufganiyot provided by the K.I. Men's Club. During the family day, children played *dreidel*, decorated cookies and made *dreidel* window art. The art is still on display on the outside entrance to the school wing. Many of the school parents came to help make this a successful event. We greatly appreciate their assistance!

We hope you will visit the school wing and see what the children have done with the art and the family tree.
