"Praying with a community alters us. Often when life hurts we pray by ourselves and assume that we are alone in our pain. When we enter a community to pray, our eyes open up. We see that we are not alone in our pain—there are others who suffer too. And we also realize that we are not alone in the world; there are dozens of people praying for us, extending their arms to help. Suddenly the nature of our prayers begins to change. We stop drowning in self-pity. We stop praying for ourselves alone. Before long we begin adding others to our prayers. We begin praying for our world. We begin to see our own troubles in a new light. Perhaps things aren't as bad as they seemed after all." Rabbi Naomi Levy wrote this thought on communal prayer. She is the author of two best-selling books: Talking to God: Personal Prayers for Times of Joy, Sadness, Struggle, and Celebration and To Begin Again: The Journey Toward Comfort, Strength, and Faith in Difficult Times.


