From Your Rabbi...



The High Holy Days are upon us! We rabbis very much enjoy when *Rosh Hashanah* falls out so late, since it gives us more time after the summer to prepare. The fall holiday season is somewhat comparable to a marathon, as each holiday gives way unto another.

There are essentially four major celebrations in the upcoming month of *Tishrei*. First comes *Rosh Hashanah*, the Jewish New Year, which tradition described as a Day of Judgment, on which God has the Books of Life and Death open before Him. That ushers in the Ten Days of Repentance, culminating in *Yom Kippur*, the Day of Atonement. That's when most Jews check out! But we hope that you'll join us for *Sukkot* as well.

Sukkot and Simchat Torah are fun and joyous days, not laden with the solemnity and seriousness of the High Holy Days, so it's a shame that more Jews don't keep the holiday spirit going by showing up for these more joyous post-Yom Kippur holidays as well.

Sukkot constitutes a sort of end of year celebration, marking the conclusion of the agricultural harvest for the outgoing year. And finally, at the very end of it all comes Simchat Torah, on which we conclude the annual Torah reading cycle and start again with the Book of Genesis.

Many have pointed out that this entire holiday structure appears to be backwards. The most logical way to structure these four holidays would be in reverse: first we should finish the *Torah* cycle; then we should have a year ending festival; then should come a Day of Atonement in advance of the New Year; and only after achieving atonement should we observe the Day of Judgment! And yet, our calendar places these four holidays in precisely the reverse order. What accounts for this?

It seems that this is all a function of God's compassion. He allows us to get the Day of Judgment out of the way first. In case you weren't sufficiently prepared for that, you then get a ten day appeal period, culminating in the Day of Atonement. After that process of judgment is out of the way, we are then allowed to celebrate *Sukkot* in peace, and then finally to formally conclude the previous year's *Torah* cycle with great joy and dancing. This shows that in Judaism, introspection and judgment should always give way to joy, and it's that sense of joy which sets the tone for the entire year to follow.

In that light, let's not suffice with attending *shul* only on the "scary" days of *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*, but to also associate *shul* with the more frequently observed times of celebration and cheer.

Wishing us all a Shanah Tovah! Rabbi Moshe Grussgott

We are planning dinners throughout the year and exciting, joyful and meaningful services. Come join us!

Rosemary and I wish you an easy *Yom Kippur* fast. May you all be sealed in the Book of Life, enjoy wonderful health and prosperity through the year.

FAST OF GEDALIAH

The *Fast of Gedaliah* is a day set aside to commemorate the assassination of Gedaliah, the Babylonian-appointed official charged with administering the Jewish population remaining in Judah following the destruction of the Temple and exile in 586 B.C.E. It is observed on the third of *Tishrei* (the day after *Rosh Hashanah*) with a fast from sunrise to sundown, and like on other fast days, the recital of special prayers ("Anenu") and the reading of selected biblical readings (Exodus 32:14; 34:1-10).

This year the fast will be on Wednesday, October 2 beginning at 5:56 a.m. and concluding at 7:32 p.m.

Inasmuch as most prayerbooks do not contain the daytime *Rosh Hashanah Kiddush* recited before luncheon upon returning home from the synagogue, we are furnishing the text for your information:

Ruth Nowack was born and raised in Newport News, Va. Forty years ago she married Bill and began a journey through the middle of the country. They lived in Indianapolis, Topeka, Little Rock, and Mobile, Al. before arriving in the Kansas City area in 2002. Coming from a conservative synagogue, they joined Ohev Shalom. They moved to K.I. in 2006 and became regular *Shabbat* attenders.

Active in the Jewish communities she has lived in, Ruth has been an officer of Sisterhood, Hadassah and synagogue boards. In Little Rock, she served as chairperson and educational director of the Jewish Federation's preschool. She taught Hebrew in Mobile, preparing her students to lead the *Shabbat* service.

At K.I. Ruth is in charge of the library and prepares the meals for *Seudah Shalishit* every *Shabbat* afternoon.

Ruth has a BA degree in Political Science and History from the University of Richmond and a Masters in Elementary Education from Spring Hill College in Mobile. A kid's book sale will be held November 7-9 at the Central branch on 87th St. She works as needed for the JOCO Election Board as a supervising judge.

Jerry Stolov, has been a resident of the Kansas City area for most of his life, with the exception of spending five years in Chicago. During this period, he also served as Special Consultant to the UMKC Chancellor for Healthcare Affairs and a member of several search committees for the UMKC School of Medicine including the Dean and several department chairs. He was responsible for providing the physician faculty for the School of Medicine, as well as the administration for all university postgraduate medical education at all affiliated teaching hospitals. Additionally, he was a charter member of the Group on Faculty Group Practice of the American Association of Medical Colleges, Washington, DC. In 1999, he began his own healthcare consulting firm, Consultants in Healthcare, serving as president until retirement in 2014. He has served on several civic boards of directors.

Jerry is a product of a traditional Jewish home and Congregation Beth Shalom, where he was a *Bar Mitzvah* and consecrated. He attended Camp Ramah in Wisconsin and was a member of the first Kansas City Israeli Pilgrimage in 1963. He has subsequently made more than 20 trips to Israel.

Jerry and Judy Elliott have been partners for more than thirty years. While having no children of his own, he has a special relationship with his sister, Harriet Langley, and the von Ende clan of three nieces and a nephew. Jerry, Judy, Harriet and the von Endes have been members of K.I. since January, 2018. Traveling, dining, concerts, sports events, reading, exercising and catering to Finn, their soft-coated wheaten terrier, keep Jerry and Judy pleasantly retired.

To quote Jerry, "Becoming a member of K.I. has been an epiphany I could not have imagined at this stage of my life.
