# From Your Rabbi...



Introducing: Ezra Grussgott! Full name: Avraham Eliezer, named after my *zaidie*. Here's my speech from the *Bris* on Sunday morning, August 18.:

Thank you everyone for coming to the *Bris* of the first Grussgott born in the great state of Kansas! We didn't name him Clark Kent in the end; but he and Superman still do share the same home state (Clark Kent's hometown is the fictional city of Smallville, Kansas). I've actually joked with Becca that the fact that Superman is from Kansas probably constitutes somewhere between 2-5% of the reason that I wanted to move here; which might not sound like a lot, but if you think about, that's actually alarmingly high...

But I digress. Our son is named after my paternal grandfather, Avraham Eliezer Grussgott, who died in 2003. My nephew Avi, plus 3 of my cousins (one Mayefsky and two Yehudas) also bear his name, but Ezra is the first of them to bear the surname Grussgott as well. My *Zaidie* had suffered a series of strokes by the time I was very young, and I only really remember him in a state of progressive cognitive decline. But for my whole life I've heard the legendary tales of him in his prime from everyone who remembers him. He was a larger than life figure, with a boisterous, outgoing personality and a sharp wit. He had a long career as the executive director of various synagogues. His love for *shul* life inspired my father to become a rabbi, which in turn inspired me to become a rabbi. *Zaidie* spent a long period as executive director of a Syrian *shul* in Brooklyn called *Beit Torah*. When he was with the Syrian

### **TASHLICH**

Tashlich comes from the Hebrew word meaning "to cast," referring to the intent to cast away our sins via this meaningful and ancient Jewish custom common to both Ashkenazi and Sephardic communities, and is performed on the first day of Rosh Hashanah. (Second day if first day is Shabbat)

Tashlich is preferably recited alongside a body of water containing fish, to remind us that just as fish are protected by the water in which they live, we pray to be protected by G-d. Also, just as fish swim freely and can suddenly be caught in a net, so too we can just as helplessly fall into the net of sin. And even as the eyes of fish are always open, so do we pray that G-d too will keep vigilant watch over his people.

Needless to say, the physical motions near the water and fish of *Tashlich* are not what grant us atonement. But if we pay attention to the symbolism and apply the sincere desire to heal our relationship with G-d as portrayed in the physical demonstrations of *Tashlich*, then it serves as a crucial part in the process of repenting and returning to G-d in purity.

Please join in and participate in the *Tashlich* service by meeting on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*, Monday, September 30 at 105th and Conser over Indian Creek at approximately 5:30 p.m. *Tashlich* will conclude in time to return to the synagogue for the 6:15 p.m. *Mincha* and *Yom Tov Maariv*.

Jews, he would speak exactly like they do, and when he was with his *Chasidic* family, he would speak exactly like they do. He was a real *chevra mann*, a social animal. And he was always the most popular and fun guy in the room.

He liked to joke about how he was the first of his cohort of friends to learn English and gain a real profession upon immigrating to America, which is why he was the first to get a real job. But his friends who didn't speak English and didn't get professional jobs had to scramble to do menial things like selling shmattas – and they all eventually became millionaires, very successful at business. It's not always a blessing to be educated! He had a great sense of humor. Although he was only about 5'4, he had a cousin, a pious and serious chassid named Naftuli, who was maybe 2 inches shorter than him. He would affectionately make fun of how short Naftuli was. He'd say "Naftuli can walk underneath the dining room table with an umbrella, and it still wouldn't hit the bottom of the table!" Apparently one time, Naftuli broke from his serious demeanor and responded very gently with: "you know, Avraham Leizer, you're not exactly Oig Melech HaBashan yourself" (Og, King of the Bashan, a famous Biblical giant).

My zaidie was a survivor of the Holocaust. In his wedding album he's crying while walking down the aisle; not only from joy but also from sadness, because he had no immediate family to walk him down the aisle. I believe two cousins walked him down. His mother had died before the war, and his father and three sisters were killed in the Shoah. His brother Nasan Nata survived the war and moved to pre-state Israel, only to be tragically killed when he was run over by a bus in Tel Aviv. When he was killed, in his jacket pocket was the ethical will that his father, my great grandfather Shmuel Yehuda Grussgott, had managed to get smuggled out of prison before being executed. Shmuel Yehuda and his sons (my grandfather and great uncle) had been living in hiding in the forest, forging documents and fake passports, and saving many lives, including some of the family of Bobover Rebbe. This is why when my fourth-grade class in Philadelphia went to visit the Bobover Rebbe in Brooklyn, he stood up for me when he heard my last name. I was only ten years old at the time, and that left quite an impression.

My great-grandfather had left his hiding spot to try and find food for all the others who were hiding with him and his sons. He was caught by Nazi collaborators and put in prison, interrogated, and eventually executed. In his tzavaa (final ethical will and testament) he writes of how they had discovered that he was circumcised, and so they knew that he was a Jew. A few small excerpts from that inspirational will, which he wrote in flawless rabbinic Hebrew, as translated into my English rendering: "And now [and behold the phrase 'and now' is always indicative of a moment of introspection and repentance – see *Midrash*] if my fate is to be like the myriads of other Jews who have been swept up in this slaughter and calamity, then let it be known that I am a Jew who still believes in the salvation of the Lord, and let any other thoughts to the contrary be considered as null and void...one request I make of my dear sons Nasan, Nata, and Avraham Eliezer, if the Lord allows them to survive this upheaval alive...that they remember me, and their mother and their sisters...that they walk in the ways of the Lord and always be kind to people...And now, Return, oh my soul, to its proper rest. Naked and bare did I come forth from the womb, and now I return to the earth..." (December, 1944)

This sense of strength and hope was passed on to his son, my grandfather, Avraham Leizer. Despite all the hardship he had seen (or perhaps precisely because of that) my *zaidie* loved life to the fullest. He wrote the book about the history and destruction of his hometown, Bardejov, which is in present day Slovakia, entitled "*B'Avdan Moladti*", "The Destruction of My Kindred" (From the Book of Esther 8:6 – "For how can I bear to see the destruction of my kindred?")

When my father and I visited Bardejov together about 15 years ago, just a few months after my *zaidie* had died, we went to the apartment of the only Jew left in that town, Mr. Meyer Shapira *z'l*. Mr. Shapira had moved back to Bardejov to be the caretaker for the synagogues and the cemetery. We arrived at Meyer's house in Bardejov unannounced; we hadn't told him we were coming. We just showed up and knocked on his door. But when he said something like "come in," we saw that, amazingly, he was literally sitting at his coffee table and reading my grandfather's book, which was open on the table right in front of him. Imagine his surprise and delight to hear who we were.

I've seen my zaidie's stationary at my Bobby Nelly's house in Brooklyn. She still has some of it left on his old desk in his home office room. On the top of each page of that stationary is printed a quote from Psalm 118:17, which is recited as part of Hallel on special holidays, as authored by King David, who, like my zaidie, was also a fighter and a survivor: "Lo Amut ki echyeh, va'asaper maaseh Yah": "I shall not die, rather I shall live, and I shall tell of the [wondrous] acts of the Lord." The text appears alongside a drawing of the Statue of Liberty, signifying Zaidie's salvation by arriving in America after the war, next to a drawing of the Kotel, signifying the sense of wonder he had that just 25 years after hiding for his life in a dark basement, he lived to see the Holy City liberated by the sovereign Jewish army in the State of Israel. His love for both America and Israel was passed on to us all.

To return to that verse on *Zaidie*'s stationary: "I shall not die, but rather I shall live." A rabbinic parsing (and I actually forgot where I first heard this, unfortunately): once King David had already said "I shall not die," doesn't the next line, "I shall live," become redundant? Is King David just saying the same thing in two different ways, for poetic effect? The answer is to be found in a line from *Braveheart*: (and for this, you need to picture the character William Wallace speaking in his Scottish accent): "Every man dies. Not every man really lives."

Chazal (the Sages) also teach that "The righteous, even in death are called alive; whereas the wicked, even in life, are called dead." The people who killed my great-grandfather were already dead souls in that sense, even before whenever it was that they may have physically died. My great-grandfather, on the other hand, still lives on now, even in death. The memory of my zaidie lives on as well, not only in all the cousins who are named after him, but in the hashkafa, the worldview of his love for life and optimism that he passed on to us all. His father was murdered due to the *mitzvah* of bris milah/circumcision (To quote once again from his father's final ethical will and testament: "And behold my forged documents could not help me, because they discovered that I was circumcised, and so they know that I am a Jew.") I know that both my greatgrandfather and his son, my zaidie Avraham Leizer, would be so proud to watch my Zaidie's namesake undergoing that very same sacred *mitzvah* as a free Jew, in the company of so much family, and especially in the presence of Zaidie's beloved wife, my Bobby Nelly, who is here with us today; she's the most special guest of all here today. May this newest Avraham Eliezer Grussgott bring nachas to his namesake and to us all.
