From Your Rabbi...



As I sit to write this, we are just starting to have discussions on how and when to begin to reopen our beloved *shul*. The reopening will take place in stages, and in consonance with the guidance being put forth by the Kansas and Johnson County governments, as well in consultation with the Rabbinical Association of Kansas City.

This is an exciting development! But it's also somewhat distressing. I had originally assumed that once this stay-at-home lockdown was over, we'd go right back to normal life as it was before. It's slowly dawning on us all that unfortunately it won't be that simple. At least for the short term, *shul* won't be quite as "normal" as that to which we're accustomed.

In the first stages of reopening at least, we'll have to sit distanced from each other, and while wearing masks. There won't be any *kiddush*. I've long cynically commented on my belief that far more Jews attend *shul* for the *kiddush* and for the socializing than they do for the rabbi's sermon! I supposed we'll now get to test that theory in practice. I sincerely hope that I was wrong!

Perhaps most painful of all, it appears to me based on what I've been reading, that parishioners at religious services are not supposed to sing (aside from the cantor or whoever it is that's leading the *davening*). This is because singing creates a higher likelihood of spreading the disease, God forbid. What will the prayer experience be like if we can't even sing together? I honestly don't know. This is uncharted territory for all of us. It does give me some measure of comfort to know that at least all *shuls* around the country are in the same boat, and that in that sense we are in this situation together.

The *Talmud* teaches "*Kol Yisrael Areivim Zeh La'Zeh*" - that all Jews are interdependent upon one another. This maxim is palpable now amongst our Jewish institutions. I participate on numerous Facebook and WhatsApp groups of rabbis and lay leaders from across the country and across the denominations, all of whom are brainstorming, commiserating, joking, and celebrating the hows and whats of what reopening our institutions will look like. Moments of uncertainty like this can either induce anxiety and fear or excitement and hope. I'm doing my best to embrace the latter sentiment more. And I hope that you will as well.

The *Talmudic* sages taught that all beginnings are difficult. This is a new beginning for our *shul*, and indeed for all *shuls* right now. I hope that you'll join us in carrying this new beginning forward with success, and also that you're as excited as I am to finally get back to *shul*; even without the *kiddush* in these early stages!

And finally, I hope that even though I'll have to stand six feet away from you, and even though I can't shake your hand right now, that you'll still be able to perceive me smiling at you beneath my mask as I wave. I really can't wait to see you in *shul* again! Praying for a good and peaceful and healthy summer for us all.

We are working to make our reopening comfortable and as convenient as possible. You, our members, will have to comply with the rules in order to make our reopening successful and safe. A complete copy of the rules will be provided to each of you. We will have people to help you if needed.

I am very excited about reopening our *shul*. In the meantime, we have services and classes on ZOOM or online. Join in to hear Rabbi Grussgott's wonderful sermons each week. It's up to you to participate.

FAST OF TAMMUZ (17TH OF TAMMUZ) THURSDAY, JULY 9 (IF WE ARE IN THE BUILDING)

The fast of the 17th of the Hebrew month of *Tammuz*, known as *Shivah Asar B'Tammuz*, is the start of a three week mourning period for the destruction of Jerusalem and the two Holy Temples. Abstaining from food and drink is the external element of a fast day. On a deeper level, a fast day is a day when G-d is accessible, waiting for us to strengthen our relationship. The sages explain: "Every generation for which the Temple is not rebuilt, it is as though the Temple was destroyed for that generation." A fast day is not only a sad day, but an opportune day. It's a day when we are empowered to fix the cause of that destruction, so that we will find ourselves living in messianic times.

LETTER TO THE CONGREGATIONAL FAMILY

Dear Kehilath Israel Family,

We see all around us a growing desire to reopen businesses and other institutions to forestall further economic damage and growing unemployment. There is also a great yearning for physical proximity and the need to relieve the isolation and loneliness of the past weeks.

To that end city, county and state officials have taken the first steps toward reopening public facilities and commercial establishments. It will likely take some time to determine how this impacts the larger community.

As a synagogue, we look to our *Torah* and its teachings for guidance concerning the challenges of how and when to reopen our building in the coming days. The imperative of *Pikuach Nefesh* (Safeguarding Life) is a bedrock principle of Jewish law. Accordingly, in taking steps toward restoring physical proximity Kehilath Israel Synagogue will place the preservation of life first and foremost; we will not knowingly put congregants and staff at significant medical risk -- or whose family members are at elevated risk in a situation where they or loved ones have to endanger their health or well-being.

Your leadership and staff, in consultation with medical professionals, are navigating through these uncharted waters. The synagogue is also working with other institutions in the Jewish community to share information, resources, and coordinate plans. Because the facts on the ground change quickly and official guidance is sometimes ambiguous, our plans regarding the reopening of the K.I. are subject to change.

Following the Centers for Disease Control, the Rabbinical Association of Greater KC, and the Orthodox Union guidance, before resuming K.I.'s communal davening, we need to see both a clear flattening of the curve and a verified safe period of 14 days following communal reopening to assess whether there will be a significant surge of new cases as other parts of society are released from mitigation. We will let you know the date of our first daily *mincha/maariv* service as soon as these metrics are met. *Shacharit* and *Shabbat* services would be added after the evening services seem to be going smoothly and safely. At each step of the way, we will keep you informed.

In the coming days, we will share more detailed guidelines for in-person services regarding masks, *kippah*, social distancing, and more. Even with such precautions, there will be some whose health or other reasons precludes attending in-person services. We will, therefore, continue virtual weekday services on Zoom to those unable to be in the building.

While our staff will continue to work in the building as well as remotely, our offices will remain closed for the time being. Of course, you may still reach staff members via telephone and email. All other classes, programs, and activities, including committee meetings, will continue to meet online for the time being.

After we implement the first steps toward reopening as described above, we will continue to evaluate how to reopen the building for other activities as well. We promise to apprise you in a timely fashion of specific plans regarding such additional developments.

Judaism teaches us that there are blessings to be found in every moment. Moreover, our experience as a people shows us that we can exist and maintain spiritual solidarity even when we cannot be with one another physically. With positive leadership, patience, and tremendous love for each other we will persevere during this challenging period, balancing our health and well-being while honoring our need and desire to participate in the life of our community.

With God's help and your support, we are confident that we will find the way forward. As always, if you have questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to be in touch!

Tisha B'Av (the ninth day of the Jewish month of *Av*) is a day of mourning during which Jews fast and bewail the destruction of the Temple and Jerusalem. Along with *Yom Kippur*, it is the only full day fast on our calendar. This fact alone should impress upon us the importance that is placed on the observance of this day for all Jews. The preceding period, known as the "three weeks" that began with the Fast of *Tammuz* on Tuesday, July 11, is considered to be the saddest time in the Jewish calendar when all evidence of joy disappears until the conclusion of *Tisha B'Av*.

Since World War II, many Jews have chosen *Tisha B'Av* as the day to commemorate the (*yahrzeit*) loss of those family members who were killed by the Nazis and their associates on dates that are unknown. The *Talmud* states that G-d decreed this particular day as a day of woe and misfortune in the very beginning of Jewish history. According to this interpretation, the ninth of *Av* was the day when the Jews in the desert of Sinai bewailed their lot when the spies brought back bad tidings from Canaan (*Parshat Shelach*). So G-d declared: "You cried without cause; I will, therefore, make this an eternal day of mourning for you." And it was then that the decree was ordered for the destruction of the Temple, and the scattering of the Jews amongst the peoples of the earth.
