From Your Rabbi...



We are currently in the period of counting the *Omer*, the 49 days between *Pesach* and *Shavuos*. As I sit to write this, we are 15 days into the *Omer*. The way that we phrase the count is, "Today is 15 days, which are two weeks and one day of the *Omer*." We are required to count both the weeks and the days.

There are many people joking now that we actually have two counts to keep track of - not just the *Omer*, but also how long we've been under the stay-at-home order! Here in the Kansas City metro area, that order came on March 24th (although it feels like quite a long time ago already!). And so, when May 1st comes, one might simulate their own *Omer*-style count for the home quarantine as follows: Today is 39 days, which are five weeks and four days of the quarantine!

The anonymous author of the *Sefer HaChinuch* (Book of Instruction), from 13th century Spain, asks why when counting the *Omer* our custom is to count up (from 1 to 49), instead of counting down from (49 to 1). When you're excited about something, he argues, you ought to count down to it! *Shavuos* commemorates the day on which we received the *Torah*, and so we ought to count down the days in anticipation of that great annual celebration.

He answers that the reason we count up is to sanctify the period of the *Omer* itself, to show that we're excited to be during that transitional period itself, not just biding our time until it's over. And so, by counting up, we chart the spiritual progress we've made during that period so far. We rise higher and higher each day.

We ought to apply the same logic to this "stay at home" period. Of course we look forward with anticipation for it to finally end, but as long as we're in it, let's commit to making progress during this time – progress in our relationships with those we might be sharing a roof with, progress in our relationship with God, and progress with ourselves. We can also strengthen relationships with those with whom we aren't currently able to meet in person by calling, texting, emailing, etc.

We look forward to seeing you back at *shul* soon. In the meantime, let's continue to connect on all of our Zoom programs. Please check your email inbox for our daily updates of the virtual stuff that we've got going on!

And finally, since I'm feeling nostalgic for a few weeks ago, when we were still able to hold large gatherings, I'll share a photo that I took of me and Josh Shron, who I bumped into at AIPAC in early March (see page 4). There were 18,000 people there! Here's to hoping we get back to being able to stage such large gatherings again soon enough.

Wishing everyone a meaningful Omer.

WHY IS IT CUSTOMARY TO EAT DAIRY ON SHAVUOT?

It has become customary on Shavuot to eat at least one dairy meal during the holiday. Some see this as symbolizing "a land flowing with milk and honey." Others point out that the very same verses that speak of bringing "the choicest first fruits of the land unto the house of the Lord your G-d" in celebration of Shavuot also stress that "You must not boil a kid in its mother's milk." (Ex. 23:19, 34:26.) On the basis of the latter part of these verses, the Oral *Torah* based its prohibition of eating meat and milk together. Hence, a separate dairy meal is deliberately eaten to emphasize the authenticity of the Oral Torah.


