From Your Rabbi...



As we enter this new year of 5781, it occurred to me that we are not too far away from a special milestone of Jewish history: the year 6,000 from creation. That's only 219 years away! That might sound like a long time, but in the grand sweep of history, it's the blink of an eye. One tradition in the Talmud states that while we pray each day for the Messiah to come and redeem the world as soon as possible, the absolute latest date that he can come is the year 6,000. This is based on the notion that, as the Psalmist says to God, "A thousand years in your sight are like a day that has just gone by, or like a watch in the night." (Psalm 90:4).

If 1,000 years is like one day to God, then 6,000 years corresponds to the 6 days of the week, after which comes the 7th day - *Shabbat*. According to this "grand scheme" theory of things, the 7th millennium will be the "*Sabbath*" of history, a millennium of complete rest and bliss: the Messianic Age. What happens after that is unclear; perhaps a new world will be created and history will begin anew.

It occurred to me the other day that perhaps a child born this past year could live to the age of 110 - just long enough, perhaps, to meet his newborn great-great-grandson in the final year of his life; then that descendant, in turn, could also live to the age of 110, and thereby see the onset of this transcendental and special year of 6,000 from creation! With increased nutrition and modern medical breakthroughs, and with life spans ever increasing, this doesn't seem so remote a possibility.

However, I write this all somewhat tongue in cheek. Jews do have a long tradition of predicting when the Messiah will come, but we also have a long tradition of rabbinic sages warning us against getting swept up in such divination. In the end of the day, while we certainly do believe in a Messianic Age with all our hearts, it's not what we are meant to dwell on day to day. On a day to day level, we simply look to do as many *mitzvot* (good deeds) in this world as we possibly can, and to make our own, current, world a better place.

Perhaps it's due to the hardship of this pandemic that I allowed myself to dream more fervently of late of the Messianic Age, which will come and save us. But in the meantime, we must commit to simply bettering the world ourselves, and not wait to be saved. I hope that this New Year brings new opportunities for us all to do so, in good health and cheer.

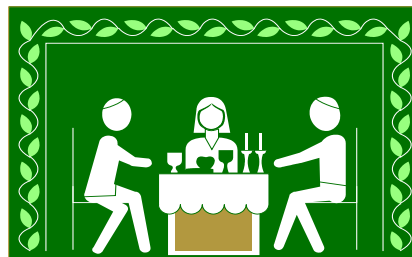
