From Your Rabbi...



This month I bear good news! After an entire year of pandemic, we at K.I. are happy to announce more steps on the path toward a full reopening.

Following *Pesach*, *Shabbat* mornings will feature a full service once again, beginning at 9 am. (With apologies to all those who had gotten used to that late 9:30am start time!)

Masks and social distancing will still be required. *Siddurim* and *kippot* and *talitot* will once again be available in their normal spots. As many of our members, especially our most vulnerable seniors, are beginning to get vaccinated, we feel that it's a good time to take more steps toward normalcy, while still maintaining strict standards of safety.

On a personal level, the change that I look forward to the most is that we are once again allowing kids to be at *shul*. All kids age 2 and up must wear a mask, and parents must ensure that their children aren't running around out of their reach. We're blessed to have Amanda Greenwood return to oversee the childcare on *Shabbat* mornings. Amanda is fully vaccinated, but she will still wear a mask for childcare. This is all an emotional moment for me and Becca. Our sons Ari and Ezra haven't been to *shul* for services in a year, and we are so eager to bring them back!

On *Pesach* night, we drink four cups of wine. The *Talmudic* sages teach that these 4 cups correspond to the four expressions of Redemption that G-d uses in speaking with Moses (Exodus 6:6-7): 1. "I will take you out..." 2. "I will rescue you..." 3. "I will redeem you..." 4. "I will take you unto Me..." This is meant to impress upon us that Redemption does not happen all at once; it happens in stages. Even when the Jews walked out of Egypt, they weren't saved from the Egyptians until one week later when the sea split and the Egyptian army was destroyed. Even after the sea split, they spent 40 years in the desert until coming to the Land of Israel. And so on. That's how we ought to view our "liberation" from this pandemic. It isn't happening all at once, but we can see ourselves coming out of it in stages. We at K.I. are excited to be embarking on that next step of "liberation" after *Pesach*!

I look forward to seeing you in *shul*. A happy and kosher *Pesach* to all.

And as our ancestors in Egypt, we are now experiencing a new sense of freedom. The world is opening. Our country is opening. Our lives are opening. And our synagogue and Kehilath Israel family are

taking steps to fully open. Springtime is upon us as never before! It is a glorious time and a time to be thankful.

It is also a time for each of us to truly reflect on the past, present and future. In this column I want to reflect on a very important part of our lives, K.I. and all it encompasses. Our synagogue has a long and very successful history and tradition, and now more than ever, I want us all to reflect on how proud we should be of K.I. While a vast number of synagogues receded during this pandemic, we found a way of remaining safe, while at the same time keeping our doors open. It was not an easy decision, but one carefully thought out and implemented with time, effort and dollars. High Holiday services were held, daily *minyans* held and all other holidays observed within the confines of our synagogue. With all the planning and work, and with G-d's help, we accomplished all with safety and health. In other words, "We did it!" While we were among the few, we did it because this is what K.I. is all about.

And now a challenge, to reflect on the present and future. K.I. has never let me down, and I believe most of you are of the same opinion. We are at a critical time in our planning. We have for the past few years, operated with a budget, balanced only with significant withdrawals from our endowments. This is not sustainable. Membership is down with a resultant loss of revenue. We have a grand building, but it is 35 years old and needs upkeep and significant capital improvements. We cannot keep expecting the same congregants to address our emergency needs.

It is difficult to ask for money, and we all have our own ideas and opinions on how things should be run and managed. At times we question board decisions. But this is natural and expected among family. We will be asking for your help in the way of membership dues, new fundraising programs and revisions to our existing programs. We ask you to willingly help. K.I. will not pressure or embarrass our congregants regarding increased giving. It is not the K.I. way. But in the spirit of these unique times and the thankfulness for renewal, your board and officers ask for your help. It is certainly an appropriate time for the renewal of spirit!

G-d bless us all and Kehilath Israel Synagogue.



Kovod Hamet Respect for the Deceased



Memorial Day services will be held in the chapel at Blue Ridge Cemetery, 1901 Blue Ridge Boulevard, on **Sunday, May 30 at 11:00 a.m.**

It is a custom in Judaism to show our respect for our ancestors, our family and our friends who are no longer with us. Whether it's the National Memorial Day, a day of *Yahrzeit*, or a day when we recite the *Yizkor* prayer, any day we go to the cemetery and visit the graves of our *mishpacha*, we perform the *mitzvah* of

Kovod Hamet.

The Kehilath Israel Cemetery Committee is again offering the Flower Planting Program for those who have family and friends interred at our K.I. Blue Ridge Cemetery. For the nominal price of \$41.00 per urn, a beautiful arrangement of colorful living plants, prepared by a commercial landscape artist, will be placed at the grave of your loved ones. This year deer repellent will be applied every three weeks during the summer to deter the deer.

If this is the first year to participate in the program, it will be necessary to order a concrete urn from the cemetery at a one time charge of \$75.00. This urn will be used every year for no additional charge other than the flowers. It is the policy of the cemetery that only flowers purchased through this program can be placed on graves.

All orders must be paid in advance and received at the synagogue office no later than April 28. This gives us the time needed so that the plants will be in full bloom by Memorial Day this year.

Give your loved ones who are interred in our cemetery the *kovod* of remembering them, whether it's with flowers or a visit to their graves. The cemetery committee is making every effort to maintain the grounds to be clean and beautiful, and extra care is being given to keep the plants watered, trimmed and green during the summer months.

Cemetery lots are available for sale to any Jewish person. Anyone interested in reserving individual lots or family sections should call the synagogue office at 913.642.1880 ext 202 for assistance.

K.I. Blue Ridge Cemetery is open every day, with the exception of *Shabbat* and Jewish holidays. The supervisor, Rod Sipe, can assist you in finding the location of a grave site. Normal visiting hours are 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. If it is necessary that you visit the cemetery at another time, please call Mr. Sipe at 816.916.3655 and make special arrangements.
