From Your Rabbi...



Rabbis like to joke about how we Jews are always complaining that the holidays are either "so early this year" or "so late this year;" they never seem to come simply "on time!" Well, this year the High Holidays are truly quite early. The first night of *Rosh Hashanah* is Labor Day Monday. I'm sure that that

confluence must have occurred sometime before, but I can't remember when.

We can express gratitude to God that this year's High Holidays are scheduled to occur as normal, as we slowly emerge from the pandemic. The pandemic has delayed our ability to navigate the international bureaucracy necessary to bring in Cantor Hayoun in time for the holidays. But we are still committed to finally bringing him here as soon as possible.

In the meantime, we're delighted to bring back Cantor Howard Shalowitz of Saint Louis for *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*. You might recall that Cantor Shalowitz's cousin, Rabbi Morton Shalowitz, of blessed memory, was the assistant rabbi of K.I. back in the 1950's. Cantor Shalowitz did an excellent job leading services in the highly difficult and unusual circumstances that pertained last year. I remain so proud that we managed to so seamlessly pull off those services. Many of us who weren't able to make it to services last year will be back again this year. In Hebrew the word for year, "Shanah," is related to the word "Lish'not," which means "to repeat." Each time a new year comes in, we're simply repeating the cycle of calendrical turnover. And so, when we wish each other a "Shanah Tovah," we're essentially wishing for each other to have a "good renewal." I think that that message is especially fitting for this year.

May it be a time of renewal, rededication, and rejuvenation, both emotional and spiritual, for all of us. I wish us all an early *Shanah Tovah*!

Just a reminder that on *Yom Kippur* night and all day, all laws of *Shabbat* apply. Also, it is very important for those of you affected by the Overland Park *Eruv* to call the *Eruv* Hotline at 913.791.8080 late in the afternoon of the eve of *Yom Kippur* to verify the *Eruv* is "up" and functioning as we do on the eve of every *Shabbat*.

TASHLICH

Tashlich comes from the Hebrew word meaning "to cast," referring to the intent to cast away our sins via this meaningful and ancient Jewish custom common to both Ashkenazi and Sephardic communities, and is performed on the first day of Rosh Hashanah. (Second day if first day is Shabbat)

Tashlich is preferably recited alongside a body of water containing fish, to remind us that just as fish are protected by the water in which they live, we pray to be protected by G-d. Also, just as fish swim freely and can suddenly be caught in a net, so too we can just as helplessly fall into the net of sin. And even as the eyes of fish are always open, so do we pray that G-d too will keep vigilant watch over his people.

Needless to say, the physical motions near the water and fish of *Tashlich* are not what grant us atonement. But if we pay attention to the symbolism and apply the sincere desire to heal our relationship with G-d as portrayed in the physical demonstrations of *Tashlich*, then it serves as a crucial part in the process of repenting and returning to G-d in purity.

Please join in and participate in the *Tashlich* service by meeting on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*, Tuesday, September 7 at 105th and Conser over Indian Creek at approximately 5:45 pm. *Tashlich* will conclude in time to return to the synagogue for the 6:30 pm *Mincha* and *Yom Tov Maariv*.

PROFESSOR SELECTED FOR NATIONAL COMMISSION ON PANDEMIC-ERA NURSING-HOME SAFETY



In June 2020, **Jessica Kalender-Rich**, M.D., FACP, associate professor of Geriatric Medicine at KU Medical Center and practicing physician, was named to the Coronavirus Commission for Safety and Quality in Nursing Homes. She was selected from more than 800 applicants. She was part of a team of experts who went to the White House to analyze how facilities could better cope with the pandemic reality. Jessica was

honored to be chosen for such a prestigious appointment.

The initial plan was for the commission's 25 members to convene weekly through July. Ultimately, they provided recommendations, and their completed report was delivered to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) shortly after Sept. 1, 2020.

In addition to her position at KU Medical Center, Kalender-Rich also is medical director for post-acute continuum of care at The University of Kansas Health System. She also is medical director at two skilled nursing facilities: one in Kansas City, Kansas, and the other in Shawnee, Kansas.



The annual service, led by **Rabbi Moshe Grussgott**, will be held in the Jack Chernikoff-Louis Dolginow Memorial Chapel at the *Kehilath Israel* Blue Ridge Chapel, 1901 Blue Ridge Boulevard, Independence, MO.

It is the Jewish tradition during this High Holiday period to visit the *Kever Avot*, the graves of our forebearers. Since it would be inconvenient for many to attend the service on a weekday between *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*, Sunday, September 12 was selected.

Customarily, each individual recites the *Molay Rachamim* prayer, a "Prayer of Consolation," at the gravesite of their loved ones. The chapel prayer booklets are available for gravesite prayers. There is a selection of prayers in the booklet, found on pages 65 through 74, in both Hebrew and English. Please return the booklets to the chapel before leaving the cemetery.

Although the cemetery is maintained by *Kehilath Israel Synagogue*, the major building improvements, new walkways, monuments and other beautification is done primarily by private contributions.
