From Your Rabbi... From Your Vice President...



As summer approaches, we are continuing our gradual return to regular *shul* routine at K.I. After months of enjoying our wonderful but unofficial "tailgate" parking lot *kiddush*, we have now reconstituted our more "official" *kiddush*, albeit still outdoors for now, consisting of prepackaged plates of food, served on the outdoor patio, and placed at a distance from each other. We are also glad to

announce that we will be resuming *seudah shelishit/shaleshudos* for *Shabbat* on Saturday evenings between *Mincha* and *Maariv*, also outdoors and in the same manner as the weekly *kiddush*, as described above.

While Johnson County has lifted their official mask mandate, we at K.I. are continuing to require masks for now while indoors during services. Our reopening committee meets every few weeks so that we are constantly reassessing and reevaluating the situation, and we'll continue to evolve and adapt our policies as needed and as is appropriate.

Becca and I are excited to be visiting our family in New York and Denver this July, the first time we'll have flown on a plane since the pandemic began. The sense of *Hodu LaHashem* - gratitude to G-d - is palpable for our family, as I'm sure it is for so many families and individuals around the country.

The bulk of July this year overlaps with "The Three Weeks" of national Jewish mourning leading up to *Tisha B'Av*, the date on which the Temple was destroyed; the saddest day of the Jewish year. In the wisdom of our calendar, *Tisha B'Av* is followed one week later by *Tu B'Shvat*, a day of rejoicing and reconciliation meant to assuage the grief of *Tisha B'Av*. As Jews, we never linger in mourning. We always move on to joy and celebration, which is our more default mode of living as Jews. *Baruch Hashem*, thank G-d, this summer it seems that the country itself will continue to progress out of this national trauma of pandemic as things continue to get progressively better.

Wishing us all a joyous, hopeful, and healthy summer!

I also work at The Accelerated Schools of Overland Park, a small, private, non-profit school for children who do not do well in a traditional school setting. I keep busy!

I believe in being positive! I have learned that doing an act of kindness for someone brings so much more happiness than buying a gift for yourself. That act of kindness is the gift! I keep a happiness journal. Each evening, I enter something that made me truly happy during the day. I list at least one good deed I did that day. And finally, I list five things that I am grateful for that day. Almost every day that includes my family and my cats.

In my spare time, I crochet...mainly baby blankets for the multitude of young couples I know who are having babies. I read, because books bring me to other worlds and entrance my imagination. I usually travel, but for the past 15 months I have been home. But that was, in a way serendipitous, as Jay and I downsized in the midst of the pandemic.

My path to *tzedakah* comes from my family. I knew from an early age that giving to others was important. My great grandfather Louis was one of the founders of the Bialystoker Home for the Aged in NYC. He also was the president of the Free Loan Society for the Bialystokers. My family supported this institution throughout my childhood. My dad, his grandson, was the president of his congregation for 11 years. Not something I recommend, to be honest!!

My path to kindness comes from my family as well, especially my mom. She taught elementary school for 30 years and had great experience in teaching kindness. I learned from her, and from my experiences in the world, that you do not need to love everyone you meet. However, you do need to be kind. You never know what type of day someone is having. By being kind, you can brighten a day for someone else and in turn make the day better for yourself.

Gemilut Chasidim, *Tzedakah*, Kindness and Family are my foundation. K.I. has become part of my family. I volunteer to keep this part of my foundation secure.

The fast of the 17th of the Hebrew month of *Tammuz*, known as *Shivah Asar B'Tammuz*, is the start of a three week mourning period for the destruction of Jerusalem and the two Holy Temples. Abstaining from food and drink is the external element of a fast day. On a deeper level, a fast day is a day when G-d is accessible, waiting for us to strengthen our relationship. The sages explain: "Every generation for which the Temple is not rebuilt, it is as though the Temple was destroyed for that generation." A fast day is not only a sad day, but an opportune day. It's a day when we are empowered to fix the cause of that destruction, so that we will find ourselves living in messianic times.

From Your Rabbi Emeritus...



As the summer months approach, a lot of people engage in reading projects. It's a wonderful way to spend the time and sharpen your mind as well. There is a wonderful set of literature called "Ethics of the Fathers" which is made up of six chapters of wise sayings and thoughts of the rabbis written almost two thousand years ago.

"Ethics of the Fathers" is found in any traditional prayer book. You can download it as an app on your computer or your iPhone, and it makes for a wonderful reading. If you are interested in a hard book or paperback, Amazon and Google have dozens of versions of "Ethics of the Fathers" that one can purchase. For many years our congregation had the tradition of reading one of the six chapters of "Ethics of the Fathers" each Saturday between Passover and the High Holy Days. When we reached chapter six, we would go back and start chapter one again. I highly recommend this as a reading project for the summer.

Despite COVID, which thank G-d seems to be on the way out now, we have continued a lot of educational opportunities for the congregation, mostly through ZOOM, which hopefully will start decreasing and meeting face to face in the months ahead. I would like to talk a little bit about my Talmud class.

My Talmud class began approximately 35 years ago. We met Monday nights, and it initially started as a Torah portion class but very quickly evolved to a Talmud class. We have covered a tremendous amount of Talmud during that time. The course is taught in English, and no knowledge of Hebrew is necessary. We have anywhere between six and a dozen people on a regular basis. We meet for eight months of the year, from the High Holy Days until the beginning of the summer. The longest lasting couple of the group have passed on, but we have others who have been with us almost as long. People come and go, try and it may not be for them, but others are always joining. If you are interested please contact me at the end of the summer, and we will talk about joining the class in the fall.

We are very proud of the fact that this is not the only longest running educational program in the Jewish community in Kansas City, but in all of Kansas City. That is quite a record!

We are just finishing the volume dealing with laws of marriage, and come fall, we will conclude that and decide as a group where we are going from there.

Also on Wednesday evenings, Rabbi Grussgott and I alternate teaching a women's study group, which fields questions from women of the congregation and community on a whole variety of subjects. It's a wonderful give and take and I think found to be very interesting.

Let's make this summer and the coming fall a wonderful educational one. Have a safe summer!

Tisha B'Av (the ninth day of the Jewish month of *Av*) is a day of mourning during which Jews fast and bewail the destruction of the Temple and Jerusalem. Along with *Yom Kippur*, it is the only full day fast on our calendar. This fact alone should impress upon us the importance that is placed on the observance of this day for all Jews. The preceding period, known as the "three weeks" that began with the Fast of *Tammuz* on Sunday, June 27, is considered to be the saddest time in the Jewish calendar when all evidence of joy disappears until the conclusion of *Tisha B'Av*.

Since World War II, many Jews have chosen *Tisha B'Av* as the day to commemorate the (*yahrzeit*) loss of those family members who were killed by the Nazis and their associates on dates that are unknown. The *Talmud* states that G-d decreed this particular day as a day of woe and misfortune in the very beginning of Jewish history. According to this interpretation, the ninth of *Av* was the day when the Jews in the desert of Sinai bewailed their lot when the spies brought back bad tidings from Canaan (*Parshat Shelach*). So G-d declared: "You cried without cause; I will, therefore, make this an eternal day of mourning for you." And it was then that the decree was ordered for the destruction of the Temple, and the scattering of the Jews amongst the peoples of the earth.
