I just watched the most surreal and amazing event on TV! William Shatner, age 90, returning from his ten minute trip to space! This is quite a case of life imitating art. Captain Kirk himself has actually now been to space, thanks to billionaire Jeff Bezos, who was nice enough to give him a ride there on his rocket.

When I sent this news item to a friend of mine who is a huge Star Trek and Sci Fi fan, he sent me the following cute response: "I don't see the big deal. He was already in space back in the 60's, when he went on a five year mission to explore new galaxies and boldly go where no man has gone before."

Shatner, much like myself, is a Jew from Montreal (one of the two places I hail from - I spent my

teen years in Montreal and my childhood in Philadelphia). He had some inspirational words when he landed back on Earth: "Looking into blackness," he said. "You look down and there's the blue down there and the black up there ... there is Mother Earth, and comfort, and there ... is that death?"

"This is life and that's death," Shatner said to Bezos, insinuating that Earth is life and outer space is death. "In an instant, you go, 'Woah, that's death!' That's what I saw... It was so moving to me. This experience, it's something unbelievable," he added.

Philosophical words! I found them moving. It reminded me of what G-d told Avraham in Bereishit (Genesis) 15:5
And He took him outside, and He said, "Please look heavenward and count the stars, if you are able to count them."

And He said to him, "So will be your seed."

The Jewish people are compared to the stars of the sky. This isn't only a numerical comparison. It means that we are supposed to lift our eyes upward to heaven and live lofty lives, dedicated to that which is transcendent. To me, the inspiring words of William Shatner, one of Abraham's myriad descendants, helps to drive that point home

May we all look to the heavens and be inspired by the transcendence of G-d who created them! Amen

LAWS AND CUSTOMS OF CHANUKAH

Chanukah begins at sundown on Sunday, Nov. 28.

Where to Light: It is customary to place the *Chanukiah* in the window of one's home, on the main table around which the family gathers, near the door, or any place where lighting of the candles will become a public event.

How to place the candles and which to light first: Chanukah candles are placed from right to left side until finally on the eighth night, the Chanukiah is full. We light the newest candle first; therefore, we always begin by kindling the candle at the left and proceed toward the right.

Saying the blessings: The blessings said over lighting *Chanukah* candles are always said immediately PRIOR to the lighting (not while lighting them). Three blessings (see below) are recited on the first night. On all other nights, we recite only the first two blessings.

Candle, oil, or electric? One might light either an oil or a candle *menorah*, the only requirement being that whichever type of light is used, that it be clear and bright. There has been a great deal of discussion as to the use of an electric *Chanukiah*. Since it is not definite as to whether or not an electric *menorah* fulfills the obligation of the lighting of *Chanukah* lights, it is best to avoid the use of such a *Chanukiah*, except for purely decorative purposes.

When to light: Generally, on a weekday night other than *Shabbat*, the *Chanukah* candles are to be lit approximately at dark. If, however, one is not at home or this time is inconvenient, they can be lit at any time during the entire night. If one has to leave home prior to dark and may not return for the rest of the evening, the *Chanukah* candles may be lit about an hour before dark, provided

that Chanukah lights will burn for a short period of time after dark.

Lighting Chanukah candles on Friday night, Dec. 3: Make sure to light the Chanukah candles before sundown (4:39 pm) and before the Sabbath candles are lit. It is better not to light the Chanukah candles at all on Friday night than to light them after dark, which is a violation of the Sabbath laws. Additionally, Jewish law requires that on every night of Chanukah, the candles must burn at least 1/2 hour after dark. Since on Friday night we must light before Shabbat starts, it is traditional to use large candles, such as Shabbat candles or tall tapers, for the Chanukiah itself.

On Saturday night, Dec. 4, it is permissible to light the *Chanukah menorah* any time after *Havdalah* (5:32 pm).

The *Chanukah* candles are to be lit simply for religious reasons and are not to be used for any secular purposes such as lighting other objects, reading lights, etc. However, this limited use of the light applies only during the first half-hour of their burning. The rabbis of old determined that the required burning time of a *Chanukah* candle is one half hour, and after that time, they may be used for any other purpose or even extinguished.




