From Your Rabbi...



On July 1st, I was honored to begin my two year term as the president of the Rabbinical Association of Greater Kansas City. I am currently experiencing a mix of feeling honored, humbled, and a little bit scared. The politics of one's own *shul* are usually enough to keep one well occupied; now I get to deal with the

collective politics of all of our shuls!

Of course, I say this all a bit tongue in cheek. You might not believe me when I say this, but we rabbis in town actually all get along quite well. This is, unfortunately, not to be taken for granted. Perhaps it's a function of Kansas City having a relatively small Jewish community that our various *shuls* just can't afford to be too divided from each other.

In any case, our community is not actually quite so small as you might think. The long awaited survey of our Jewish community recently came out. I encourage everyone to get ahold of it and peruse it. It turns out there are just over 20,000 Jews in the greater Kansas City area. That's not just a tiny *shtetl* where everyone knows each other, even while also not being as large as the New Yorks and Los Angeleses of the world.

In August we observe *Tisha B'Av*, the saddest day of the Jewish year, commemorating the destruction of both Temples in Jerusalem. The *Talmud* teaches that our Temple was destroyed, and our sovereignty in Israel lost, due to the rampant hatred that existed within the Jewish community at that time. Rabbi Abraham Isaac Kook, the first *Ashkenazi* Chief Rabbi of the modern day Jewish community in Israel, taught that if the Temple was destroyed due to unbridled hatred, it can only be rebuilt through the power of unbridled love. "Unbridled" means that even when you don't think someone deserves it, you extend them some extra grace and affinity anyway. It's easy to preach that way of acting in the world, but much harder to actually embody it.

In our politically charged time, and in this season of our commemoration of great historical tragedy, let's try to embody some of that unrestrained love and do our small part to help heal the world.

Tisha B'Av (the ninth day of the Jewish month of Av) is a day of mourning during which Jews fast and bewail the destruction of the Temple and Jerusalem. Along with Yom Kippur, it is the only full day fast on our calendar. This fact alone should impress upon us the importance that is placed on the observance of this day for all Jews. The preceding period, known as the "three weeks," that began with the Fast of Tammuz on Sunday, July 17, is considered to be the saddest time in the Jewish calendar, when all evidence of joy disappears until the conclusion of Tisha B'Av.

Since World War II, many Jews have chosen *Tisha B'Av* as the day to commemorate the (*yahrzeit*) loss of those family members who were killed by the Nazis and their associates on dates that are unknown. The *Talmud* states that G-d decreed this particular day as a day of woe and misfortune in the very beginning of Jewish history. According to this interpretation, the ninth of *Av* was the day when the Jews in the desert of Sinai bewailed their lot when the spies brought back bad tidings from Canaan (*Parshat Shelach*). So G-d declared: "You cried without cause; I will, therefore, make this an eternal day of mourning for you." And it was then that the decree was ordered for the destruction of the Temple, and the scattering of the Jews amongst the peoples of the earth.

* When *Tisha B'Av* occurs on Saturday night, we do not recite the regular *Havdalah*. It is postponed to Sunday night. We do recite a blessing over either a *Havdalah* candle or an electric light, and that is the total *Havdalah* for that evening. Sunday night, when the fast ends, we recite *Havdalah* over a beverage, and we recite the last paragraph of the *Havdalah* only.





COMMUNITY-WIDE COURSE: "JUDAISM FOR CONVERSION CANDIDATES" BEGINS IN AUGUST
