From Your Rabbi...



I just experienced my favorite Shabbat at K.I. since my tenure here. I know that it was also the favorite of many others as well. We finally got to hear our new chazzan, Cantor Aron Hayoun, in action. It is an understatement to say that he did not disappoint. Many congregants echoed my own sentiments when I expressed that he

transported me back to my childhood. His *davening* channels a deep Jewish spiritual chord that resonates through time. How blessed and fortunate we are to have **Cantor Hayoun** as our *chazzan*. *Shabbat* morning services this past week saw the highest attendance since I've been here, and as I joked on *Shabbat*, I doubt that it was to hear my sermon...or even for the *cholent kiddush* afterwards.

Just as we transition into a new era of professionalism and uplift in our services at K.I., so too, there is another more bittersweet transition afoot. Our president, **Marty Gorin**, is ending his tenure and handing the reins over to **Joe Adamous**. Marty was the face of K.I. for me when I first applied for the job here four years ago.

We've had a great "melech" in Marty to this point, and we are getting a great one in Joe from hereon; we have a premier Levite in Cantor Hayoun; and as for my part, I humbly try to be the best "kohen" that I can manage. All of the pieces are in place! These are exciting times at K.I. I invite us all to join me in thanking Marty for his years of service to K.I., which will still continue; in welcoming Joe as our new president and praying confidently for his success; and finally, I invite us all to come to shul sometime soon to meet and hear our new chazzan. Ashreinu - we are blessed and fortunate.

WHY IS IT CUSTOMARY TO EAT DAIRY ON SHAVUOT?

It has become customary on *Shavuot* to eat at least one dairy meal during the holiday. Some see this as symbolizing "a land flowing with milk and honey." Others point out that the very same verses that speak of bringing "the choicest first fruits of the land unto the house of the Lord your G-d" in celebration of *Shavuot* also stress that "You must not boil a kid in its mother's milk." (Ex. 23:19, 34:26.) On the basis of the latter part of these verses, the Oral *Torah* based its prohibition of eating meat and milk together. Hence, a separate dairy meal is deliberately eaten to emphasize the authenticity of the Oral *Torah*.

K.I. FRED DEVINKI RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

The students in the K.I. Fred Devinki Religious School have had a busy semester. We have had special Sundays that the entire school has learned together. Students discussed ways to help the earth for *Tu B'Shevat* and made bookmarks to help them remember one or two special ways to do this. For *Purim*, they made a surprise *mishlach manot* bowl for their parents with their picture on the inside that said "Happy *Purim*." In addition to all these special Sundays, the students are always busy learning with their teachers every Sunday. They do morning *tefillot*, learn *parsha*, learn about upcoming holidays, learn *mitzvot*, learn about *Torah* and much more.

Under the direction of *Morah* Bridey, the 2nd and 3rd graders created a movie all about the *Torah*. They discussed what the *Torah* is, how it's made, how it's decorated and how we honor the *Torah*. They would love to talk to you about it, if you ask them.

Please visit the entrance to our school wing where you can see some new bulletin board displays. The students in the Tuesday's Hebrew class are learning the names of body parts in Hebrew and have made creations to show off their new knowledge.

We only have two sessions left, May 1 and May 15. For our final session on May 15, we will have a field day in honor of the upcoming holiday of *Lag B'Omer*, which is on May 19. In addition to playing field games, they will learn about the plague that stopped on this day and that *Lag B'Omer* is about loving and respecting fellow Jews.


