## From Your Rabbi...



We had a truly special and lovely *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur* at K.I. It seems to me that our attendance was back up to where it had been pre-pandemic. This is in no small part due to our new cantor, *Chazzan* Hayoun, who was in rare form, together with the choir, who got to perform for the first time in three years. I want to thank the cantor and the choir members for the many hours of practice that they put in during the past few months.

We only had one snag, and a sort of spooky one at that: at the end of the *Neilah* (which marks the end of *Yom Kippur*), with ten minutes to go, the microphone gave out! Was this a sign from Heaven, some people wondered? I prefer to think that it was G-d telling us that our prayer to that point had already

been heard, with ten minutes to spare before the Divine "deadline." Our sound system is somewhat complicated, since it has to adhere to certain *halachic* parameters. Additionally, we are currently using a temporary system. I'm pleased that we are now in the thick of planning for a brand new, permanent, and state of the art sound system, which we hope will be in place in time for the next High Holiday cycle year.

Another eerie coincidence happened the night before *Neilah*, during *Kol Nidre*. I opened my remarks that night by joking that I had asked Evaristo to inform me if Aaron Judge of the New York Yankees should hit his 62nd home run that night, thereby breaking the American League record held by Roger Maris (who played for the Kansas City A's before going to the Yankees!). Judge did indeed hit his record setting home run that night. I looked up the exact time that he did so, and it was 7:07 pm Central Time which, as it happens, was the exact time at which I was delivering my remarks! It may very well have been mere seconds after I had mentioned it. As an avid baseball fan, I mentioned then that Judge is, to my mind, the true record holder for all of baseball, since he is untainted by steroids, unlike the other players who have also surpassed Maris's old record.

I have mentioned often that baseball is the most traditional of sports. Only in baseball is there, as in Judaism, a concept of "Yeridat HaDorot," the decline of the generations. This is the notion that we are not as great as those who came before us, who must be looked upon with great reverence. Baseball pays tributes to heroes of decades past in a way that no other North American sport does.

As we enter the month of November, with no official Jewish holidays except for the one that we American Jews have aptly adopted - Thanksgiving - let's give thanks for the traditions that have been bequeathed upon us by those who came before us, and let's be grateful that we are very much committed to honoring our past in that vein at K.I.

On Tuesday, November 8, we will have a general election throughout the entire country. There are many important issues and candidates running for office.

I want to draw your attention to what may seem like a small issue on the ballot. Six of the seven state Supreme Court judges in Kansas face re-election. The ballot issue is should a particular judge be retained in office - 99% of

the time judges are retained. This time however these six judges are being challenged by the far right and the anti-abortion lobby. Before we had the election last August that stopped any attempt at changing the Kansas Constitution to make abortion harder to get in Kansas, the Kansas Supreme Court ruled that abortion was a woman's choice and her own decision. Now there is an attempt to remove these six judges who voted in favor of free choice for abortion. Please vote to retain all six Supreme Court judges. It is a long ballot and the judges portion might slip by your attention.


