I am writing this days after news broke of the horrific terrorist massacre in Israel. As I write this, the brave soldiers of the IDF are defending our Jewish Homeland, and our prayers and support must be with them day and night. Like many of us, I am simply at a loss for words at the moment. When at a loss for words, our tradition teaches us to use the words of Psalms. As such, I encourage us to all to recite daily the words of Psalm 121 (which I've included below) with the safety

of Israel and her people in mind. I am also comforted by the words of the *Haggadah*:

And it is this that has stood by our ancestors and for us: For not only one enemy has risen up against us to destroy us, but in every generation they rise up to destroy us. But the Holy One, Blessed be He, delivers us from their hands.

With God's helps, the State of Israel will prevail against this enemy as well. *Am Yisrael Chai* - the People of Israel lives.

- 1 A song for ascents. I shall raise my eyes to the mountains, from where will my help come?
- 2 My help is from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth.
- 3 He will not allow your foot to falter; Your Guardian will not slumber.

- 5 The Lord is your Guardian; the Lord is your shadow; [He is] by your right hand.

The High Holidays have come and gone. The two days of *Rosh Hashanah*, especially the first day, were very pleasant, since I had the pleasure of seeing most of our members, even if from afar. **Cantor Hayoun**, and the choir get most of the credit. They practiced their singing for many hours and days in preparation. After having listened to our choir for many years, a service without them would be boring.

On a personal note, during the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*, while chanting the long phrase of "on *Rosh Hashanah*, it's written and on *Yom Kippur*, it's sealed...." I became very emotional. I associated it with the fate of my beloved wife in the preceding year. I wondered since *Hashem* knows our faith why he doesn't give us some clue or tip as to what to expect in our destiny.

On a happier note, the festival of *Sukkot* has been wonderful. We have a spacious and beautiful *sukkah*. This year we were fortunate to have had three opportunities to have dinner in our *shul sukkah*: a Friday night dinner, a Men's Club dinner with music, and a pizza dinner for KI NEXT.

On the first day of *Sukkot*, we had the good fortune to hear Rabbi Ira Grussgott, (Rabbi Moshe Grussgott's father) conducting the *Shacharit* service, and delivering a unique sermon. It was nice to see *Rav* Ira Grussgott and his wife Miriam visiting K.I. and Kansas City.

I have always been curious about the symbolism of shaking the *lulav* and *etrog*. Depending on what source one asks, the explanation could be that by moving *lulav* and *etrog* in all directions, we want to touch the whole world or we are concerned about the whole world. Another source explains it that the six directions represents six emotions of kindness, discipline, harmony, perseverance, submission and connection.

I especially enjoyed the shaking of the *lulav* and *etrog* while in a procession on *Hoshanah Rabbah* day (see picture below.)

Lastly, I am anxiously awaiting this year's unique Grand Givers event with singers from Paris, France, accompanied by Cantor Hayoun. I hope to see a good showing of our congregation to make Cantor Hayoun, proud and also help our number one fundraising event.

Just before the *Focal Point* went to print, we were hit with a tragedy in Israel. We don't really know the total human casualties and material damages just yet. The condition in Israel is dire and we don't know how long the war is going to last and what the final casualty numbers will be. But we need to come together to help and support Israel. I hope with all of my heart, that our K.I. kids (and their parents) will have beautiful memories of High Holidays 2023 to share with future generations of children of their own.
